College & Career of the Week: While considering colleges for your shopping list, look west to the <u>State University of New York</u>, aka SUNY. <u>SUNY</u> is the largest comprehensive university system in the United States, with 64 individual institutions that serve approximately <u>350,000 undergraduate</u> students (www.suny.edu). With <u>4,352 majors offered</u>, there is a program for everyone. See a complete <u>map of SUNY campuses</u> <u>here</u>. *Annual <u>average tuition for out-of-state students is \$16,980</u> (2019-2020). Check out those campuses closest to CT - <u>SUNY/Purchase</u>, <u>SUNY/Stony</u> <u>Brook</u> (Long Island), <u>SUNY/Albany</u>, <u>SUNY/Farmingdale</u> (Long Island) and <u>SUNY/New</u> Paltz. "Graphic designers create visual concepts, using computer software or by hand,*

to communicate ideas that inspire, inform, and captivate consumers", (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). <u>Graphic designers</u> are usually employed by various service-related businesses, while others choose to be self-employed and find freelance work. A bachelor's degree is required for most entry level positions and graphic designers will want to share their portfolios when job hunting. The average annual salary is \$52,110 with declining job opportunities expected (-4%) through 2029 (BLS, 2019). Working Papers: Due to restrictions governed by the Connecticut Department of Labor, some jobs may require WORKING PAPERS. In order to obtain WORKING PAPERS, a student must present a promise of employment letter from the hiring employer as well as a copy of **one** of the following: student's birth certificate, passport, driver's license or a learners permit. WORKING PAPERS are needed for formal employment by students under the age of 17. You may obtain working papers in the College & Career Center.
