College and Career of the Week: This week's college is the **University of Michigan** and the career of the week is **Pharmacist**. The <u>University of Michigan</u> is located in Ann Arbor, Michigan, approximately 690 miles from the BOW area. Founded in 1817, it was the <u>first public university</u> in the Northwest Territories. Today the university enrolls just over 30,000 undergraduate students and offers 275 degree programs. Also, UMich <u>retains 97%</u> of their freshman class. <u>Annual costs</u> are approximately \$67,000 per academic year (tuition, fees, room and board) for out of state students. <u>"Pharmacists</u> dispense prescription medications to patients and offer expertise in the safe use of prescriptions." (US Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). Additional duties include consulting with patients regarding health issues, filing insurance claims and managing pharmacy staff. In order to become a pharmacist, one must obtain a Pharm.D. degree and must pass TWO licensing exams. The median salary is \$126,120 per year (BLS, 2019) and projected employment shows little or no change in the profession through 2028. Attention seniors (and parents of seniors): We will soon begin the Senior Service Learning Program (SSLP), also known informally as the "internship program". *If you are interested in participating in this year's SSLP, please read on.* SSLP 2020 will run from May 18th until June 5th. During this time, participating seniors will become interns at predetermined job sites. If you are a senior in good standing (no attendance or discipline issues) and have at least a 2.0 unweighted GPA, you may qualify to participate in SSLP. <u>The first step is to register for the</u> <u>mandatory, one-hour SSLP workshop</u>.
