College/Career of the Week: The University of Connecticut at Avery Point is a regional branch campus, located on 72 acres along the southeastern coast in Groton, Connecticut. Approximately 600 undergraduates are enrolled and most plan to transfer to the UCONN/Storrs campus once they have earned at least 54 credits. However, students also have the option to attend UCONN/Avery Point for complete bachelor's programs in 5 majors such as marine sciences, maritime studies and American studies. While UCONN/Avery Point does not have dormitories, off campus housing is available in the area. Students are offered many recreational activities via the Avery Point Athletic Center that includes a 6-lane pool, gym and fitness center. Both recreational and intercollegiate sports are also available (compete in the NJCAA) and includes men's baseball & basketball, women's basketball and a sailing team. <u>Annual tuition</u> for in-state residents is \$15,878 (2021-2022). "Marine biologists study life in the oceans, and sometimes the oceans themselves. They may investigate the behavior and physiological processes of marine species, or the diseases and environmental conditions that affect them. They may also assess the

impacts of human activities on marine life" (environmentalscience.org, 2022). Entrylevel positions for <u>marine biologists</u>, also known as wildlife biologists, usually require a bachelor's degree. The national median salary is \$66,350 and the profession is expected to have **slower than average job growth at 5% through 2030** (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). Are you a student thinking of pursuing a career in law enforcement?
