

College/Career of the Week: Hampton University is a private university located in Hampton, Virginia. Founded in 1868, Hampton is an HBCU (historically black college or university) with a fascinating history. There are approximately 3,300 students enrolled with almost 100 majors offered such as nursing, business, criminal justice, aviation management and education. Hampton students are heavily involved in many clubs and organizations, as well as intramurals/recreation sports. In addition, varsity athletes can choose from 14 teams that compete in NCAA Division 1 (Big South Conference, changing to the Colonial Athletic Association in July 2022). Annual tuition, room and board is \$42,648 (2021-2022). For more information, go to Hampton's admissions website, look at their guick facts, or take a virtual tour. "Probation Officers and correctional treatment specialists assist in rehabilitation of law offenders in custody or on probation or parole" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). They establish and maintain relationships with their clients while encouraging them to make positive life choices. Entry-level positions as a probation officer usually require a bachelor's degree. The median salary is \$55,690 and slower than average job growth is expected **4%) through 2030** (BLS, 2020) however as those currently in the field retire, additional openings are expected. Parent Drop Off/Pick Up: As a reminder, the morning drop off location is on the side of the school following the one-way traffic flow from North Pease out to Newton Road. Students can enter the building starting at 7:10am. The afternoon pick-up location is in the front of the school (entering campus from Newton Road) following into the bus loop. Parent pick-up begins immediately after buses exit campus. Please note: it is not safe for students to be picked up in the Woodbridge town center or along Meetinghouse Lane, especially with the current amount of snow, the width of Newton Road, and the size and number of buses exiting ARHS property. Please keep students safe by adhering to the expectations that you pick your child up on school property at the end of the day.

Report Cards Issued/Loss of Credit update: Report cards for marking period 2 and midterm exams were issued on Thursday, February 3rd. Midyear grade reports for seniors will be sent to colleges during the upcoming week. Students who appealed a loss of credit will receive notice of the committee's decision by the end of next week.
