The 12 Community Colleges in Connecticut offer students the opportunity to attend college close to home without sacrificing quality AND saving themselves money. Academic programs range from 2-year associate degrees to 9-month certificates in various disciplines. Learn more about transfer options to bachelors' degree programs at both public and private colleges and universities. Campuses closest to home are Gateway CC in New Haven, Housatonic CC in Bridgeport and Naugatuck Valley CC in Waterbury. Annual tuition for full time, in-state residents is \$4,476.00 (2020-2021). "Diagnostic Medical Sonographers and Cardiovascular Technologists and Technicians (including vascular technologists) operate special imaging equipment to create images or to conduct tests" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). Medical sonographers work in hospitals, clinics and physicians' offices where doctors need visual tests to accurately diagnose patients. The average annual salary is \$74,320 for medical sonographers and \$57,720 for technicians (BLS, 2019). While the US military branches all use the ASVAB as an admissions exam, students do NOT have to be interested in military careers to take the test. FAFSA is used by colleges, universities and the federal government to help determine a student's qualifications for grants, loans, scholarships, work-study opportunities, institutionally funded aid programs and other assistance. In order to obtain WORKING PAPERS, a student must present a promise of employment letter from the hiring employer as well as a copy of **one** of the following: student's birth certificate, passport, driver's license or a learners permit. WORKING PAPERS are needed for formal

employment by students under the age of 17. You may obtain working papers in the College & Career Center.
