- No quotations are necessary, but do use specific examples and details in your response.
- We care most about *what* you have to say, but *how* you say it is important too. Try to write as clearly and correctly as you can although you won't have time to revise your work.
- Try your best! You will NOT receive a grade for this response, but you will get credit for having read the book and completing the response. You will also get some feedback from your teacher that will help you set some goals for this year and let your teacher know more about you as a reader, writer, and thinker.

CHOOSE ONE OF THE PROMPTS BELOW:

1. How did this book change your perceptions or preconceived notions about the culture or setting of the book? Use examples from the reading to support your ideas.

2. If this book was about one person's story or about a group, what challenges did he/she/they have to overcome because of their culture, nationality, religion, ethnicity, etc? Give a strong, specific example and explain clearly how this person/group met this challenge.

3. What's your biggest "take-away" about the setting of the book and how it's important to the story? What did you learn about the place or culture? Include specific details and clearly explain your response.

4. Is there something else special about this book that you'd like to write about? If so, get your topic approved by your teacher and go for it! Just be sure to include specific details, elaborating fully and clearly.
