Occupational therapists (OTs) treat patients who have injuries, illnesses, or disabilities through the therapeutic use of everyday activities (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). Occupational therapists help people regain strength and activity levels while recovering from illness or injuries. While most OTs work in medical offices, some work in schools or visit patients in their homes. A masters' degree and state license is required to work as an OT. The average annual salary for OTs is \$84,950 with much faster than average growth expected (16%) through 2029 (BLS, 2019).
