College and Career of the Week: This week's college is the **United States Coast Guard Academy**, and the career of the week is **Civil Engineer.** The United <u>States Coast Guard Academy</u> is located in New London, Connecticut, approximately 55 miles from the BOW area. The Coast Guard has a proud <u>history</u> that dates back to 1790. The Academy began granting Bachelor of Science degrees in 1941. USCGA students do NOT pay tuition. However, they are required to serve in the USCG or other military branch after graduation. The Coast Guard Academy offers <u>majors</u> in civil, electrical and mechanical engineering, as well as cyber systems, naval architecture and others. Please visit USCGA's beautiful campus at one of their <u>upcoming admissions events</u>. "<u>Civil Engineers</u> design, build, and supervise infrastructure projects and systems". (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2018). They work on various projects such as building roads, tunnels, buildings, airports, bridges, water supply systems and sewage treatment systems. Expected job growth is average at approximately 6% through 2028 and the average annual salary is \$ 86,640. ***NEW* AP Registration Timeline**: College Board has moved the registration process for AP exams to the fall. Therefore, students will need to decide to take their AP exam(s) much earlier than in previous years.

- Registration dates: Tuesday September 3, 2019 through October 1, 2019.
- AP Exam Fee: \$97 per exam
- AP Seminar and Research Exam fees are \$145 each.
- Late Fees: after October 1, 2019, there will be a late fee of \$10 per exam until the final ordering deadline. Please use <u>this link</u> to register and pay.
