College (Search) of the Week: *Message from Amity HS's College and Career Center* - Happy New Year to Amity students and families! Rather than just another "College of the Week" column, we're changing things up a bit. Instead, here is a listing of resources for juniors to begin the college search process. Students and family members should also take advantage of this season's upcoming virtual workshops (see schedule here).

Recommended resources for college search:

• **Naviance** is the program Amity HS uses for college search and career planning. Since seniors need to use Naviance when processing applications/transcripts, **students are strongly encouraged to use this program**. Naviance's "scattergrams" provide historical acceptance data based on our alumni results. Juniors can learn how to log on via the "Grade 11

Counseling" Google classroom page. Need help in getting started? Here is a <u>14-minute basic tutorial</u>.

- TEN BEST (free) COLLEGE SEARCH SITES sponsored by Student Loan Hero.
- <u>CollegeData.com</u> by 1st Financial Bank USA is a free, college advisory service. Provides various data about colleges such as acceptance rates, graduation rates, costs, financial aid, etc.
- <u>College Scorecard</u> by the US Department of Education was created to help students/families determine the *cost and value of colleges*. You may also want to read <u>"How to Navigate New College Scorecard Data"</u> by US News & World Report.

Career of the Week: Dentists diagnose and treat problems with patients' teeth, gums, and related parts of the mouth" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). Dentists usually work in offices with a small support staff of dental assistants, dental hygienists and administrative assistants. To become a dentist, one must complete a four-year degree program in premedical studies (or other science related field) and gain acceptance to a dental school. Before working as a dentist, dental school graduates must pass required state licensing examinations among other requirements. The average annual salary is \$159,200 with average job growth expected (3%) through 2029 (BLS, 2019). Working Papers: Due to restrictions governed by the Connecticut Department of Labor, some jobs may require WORKING PAPERS. In order to obtain WORKING PAPERS, a student must present a promise of employment letter from the hiring employer as well as a copy of **one** of the following: student's birth certificate, passport, driver's license or a learners permit. WORKING PAPERS are needed for formal employment by students under the age of 17. You may obtain working papers in the College & Career Center.

ASVAB test will be given at Amity High School on **Wednesday**, **April 21**, **2021 at 8:00am**. Any student in grades 10, 11 or 12 is welcome to take the test. The ASVAB or "Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery" is an online, multiple-choice test that helps students identify career strengths. **Students may register to take the test by**

signing up <u>here</u>. While the US military branches all use the ASVAB as an admissions exam, *students do NOT have to be interested in military careers to take the test*. **Taking the ASVAB does not obligate students to enlist!** Please <u>visit this link</u> for more information.
