College/Career of the Week: The <u>University of Connecticut at Stamford</u> is a regional branch campus that serves approximately 2,100 students. The majority of students who begin their undergraduate education at UCONN/Stamford choose to transfer to UCONN/Storrs once they have earned at least 51 credits. However, students also have the option to attend UCONN/Stamford for complete bachelors programs in <u>majors</u> such as <u>business data analytics</u>, <u>computer science</u> and studies. The <u>campus</u> is located in <u>downtown Stamford</u>, amongst restaurants, businesses and culture. It is easily accessible by train (Amtrak and Metro North Railroad lines) and apartment style <u>housing</u> is available within 5 minutes from campus. <u>Annual tuition</u> for in-state residents is \$15,888 (2021-2022). "<u>Management analysts</u> recommend ways to improve an organization's efficiency" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). <u>Management analysts</u> (also known as management consultants) often work in teams to create solutions. A bachelor's degree

as well as some industry experience is usually required for entry-level positions in this profession. The national median salary is \$87,660 and the profession is expected to have *faster than average job growth at 14%* through 2030 (BLS, 2020). **March 18**<sup>th</sup> **No School for Students:** As a reminder, Friday March 18<sup>th</sup> will be a full day professional learning day for Amity faculty and staff. There will be no school for students on that day.

**March 23<sup>rd</sup> Modified Day at ARHS:** Please note that Wednesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> is the day that 11<sup>th</sup> grade students at Amity will take the online CT State SAT. On that same day, 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the Practice ACT (PACT) and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will participate in programing throughout the day. Seniors who are participating in SSLP will finalize their work sites while students who are planning on SIP or not participating in either program will be in the school building that day. It will be an early dismissal day for all students (12:12).

**End of Marking Period Date Change:** The end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> marking period has been changed from Friday, March 25<sup>th</sup> to Tuesday, March 29<sup>th</sup>. Fourth marking period will begin on March 30<sup>th</sup> and report cards will be released prior to April break. At this time, the last day of school/exams for the 2021-2022 year is scheduled for Thursday, June 16<sup>th</sup> based on the snow disruptions from this year.

**Parent Course Selection Confirmation:** Students' official last day for registering for classes for the 2022-2023 school year is today. Once your child has registered for classes, you will need to log on to your parent portal through PowerSchool to review and confirm your child's course selection. The deadline for parent approval is next Friday, March 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Peer Tutoring Help**: We will begin offering "Working Wednesdays Drop-In Peer Tutoring" on Wednesday, March 9<sup>th</sup> and continue through June 1st. This is in addition to our other services - we still offer drop-in peer tutoring after school (on Tuesdays and Thursdays in the Career Center) as well as 1 to 1 tutoring by completing the form HERE.

**Attention Juniors!** Are you interested in learning more about **West Point Military Academy**? If so, consider applying to their **Summer Leaders Experience** (deadline is March 15<sup>th</sup>). SLC is a weeklong, immersive on-campus experience. (Two sessions are available, May 28 – June 3 OR June 4 – June 10, 2022.) There is no fee to apply, and generous need-based scholarships are available. Standardized test scores are not required, but ideal applicants have a strong academic background, have participated in team sports and other extracurricular activities. Note: When you apply for SLE, you are also submitting an admissions screening application.

**The ASVAB - Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery** will be given here at Amity on **Thursday, April 21, 2022**. While the ASVAB is used by the military for recruiting purposes, individuals for career exploration and identifying skills for future careers also use it. Students may take the test for personal use and there is NO military obligation from participating. For more information, please visit the <u>ASVAB website</u> <u>here</u>. **AP LATE registration is open!** Thank you to everyone who signed up during the general registration window. For those who missed it, you can still sign up with a late fee. Use this <u>link</u> to register and pay for AP exams:

- The late registration window is from now until March 1, 2022. There is a \$40 extra late fee (as set by CollegeBoard, not ARHS)
- AP Exam Fee: \$100 per exam (\$140 with late fee)
- AP Seminar and Research Exam Fees: \$148 per exam (\$188 with late fee)

Are you a student thinking of pursuing a career in law enforcement? The New Haven FBI Field Office in partnership with the Yale University Police Department will be offering a summer youth program called Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) from July 17-July 23, 2022. Students who are graduating in the spring of 2022 are not eligible. Students 16-18 yrs. of age are eligible. This is an overnight camp at Yale University. FLEYA will give 30 Connecticut high school students between the ages of 16 and 18, an inside look at today's FBI, while simultaneously exposing them to various local, state and federal law enforcement agencies and practices. Classroom training will be provided on various subjects including: cyber technology, investigative forensics, domestic and international terrorism, civil rights (hate crimes) and more.
