College and Career of the Week: <u>High Point University</u> is a private university located in High Point, North Carolina (near Winston-Salem), approximately 610 miles from the BOW area. <u>Founded in 1924</u> by the Methodist Protestant Church, HPU currently enrolls approximately 4,500 undergraduate students. Most popular <u>majors</u> include communications, business, kinesiology and exercise science, biology and psychology. HPU's 16 <u>athletic teams</u> compete in the <u>Big South</u> <u>Conference</u> (NCAA Division 1). Ranked #1 in the USA for the <u>best college dorms, annual</u> <u>tuition</u>, room & board is \$55,658 per year (2021-2022).
