College and Career of the Week: College and Career of the Week: This week's college is Sacred Heart University and the career of the week is Accountant. Sacred Heart University is located in Fairfield, Connecticut approximately 20 miles from the BOW area. Founded as an independent, Catholic university in 1963, SHU enrolls nearly 9,000 students. Students can choose from over 70 majors within the 5 colleges and 2 schools. Annual costs are approximately \$60,000 per academic year (tuition, fees, room and board). Accountants perform work for industry as all organizations need financial recording and reporting services. Most entry level accountant jobs will require a bachelors' degree. Average job growth is expected

May, 2020, Senior Service Learning Program Prep— if you are planning to participate in the Senior Service Learning Program (SSLP or internship) OR the Senior Interest Project (SIP), please check your school email OFTEN. The SSLP is an unpaid, experiential learning program where seniors may leave school to work at job sites. The SIP gives seniors an opportunity to conduct a research or mini-capstone

project on a topic of one's own choosing. BOTH programs occur during the last month of the school year **and more information will be emailed to all seniors before the winter vacation.** Participants are expected to meet program deadlines beginning in January, 2020.

Transcript Request Deadline: Please be aware that December 9th is the transcript request deadline for any students who would like transcripts sent out for a 1/1/2020 application deadline.

Additional Scholarship Resource Information: Naviance is only one of the many resources for researching scholarships.
