
ARHS COMMUNITY HAPPENINGS NEWSLETTER, March 31, 2023

Amity Happenings and Information

- Driving, Student Parking and Student Drop-Off Information: With the return of warmer
 weather, we are seeing an increase in some behaviors of concern at the start and end of the
 day, and our friends at the Woodbridge Police Department have a few reminders for
 everyone:
 - There has been an increase in fast and otherwise unsafe driving (such as stopping suddenly, not driving with the established flow of drop-off traffic, and parents driving in the faculty parking lot) before and after school recently. All of these put our students and staff at risk, so please make sure to drive in a manner that follows the rules and keeps everyone safe.

The WPD has received multiple complaints regarding students parking on Meetinghouse Lane recently. Meetinghouse Lane parking is meant to be short-term parking only, but there are some students parking there for the full school day. As a result, some of our elderly residents with business at Human Services and others visiting the town center are forced to park elsewhere. The WPD has informed us that they plan to enforce the parking violations beginning next week, so please park at school instead.

College and Career of the Week

<u>Lafayette College</u> (LC) is a private, liberal arts college located in <u>Easton, Pennsylvania</u>, approximately 165 miles from the BOWA area. <u>Founded in 1826</u>, LC offers "<u>51 areas of study within 4 academic divisions</u>", including engineering and pre-professional studies. LC boasts a 100% <u>law school</u> acceptance <u>rate for graduates</u>. <u>Campus life</u> is vibrant as 93% of students reside there and get involved in the 187 <u>clubs and organizations</u> offered. There are <u>23 athletic teams</u> that compete in the <u>Patriot League</u>, NCAA Division 1. <u>Annual tuition, room and board</u> is \$ 75,954 (2022-2023). "Paralegals and legal assistants perform a variety of tasks to support lawyers" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021). Paralegals and legal assistants work in offices for law firms, government agencies, and corporations doing research and preliminary work for legal cases. Most entry level positions in this field will require at least an associate degree. Some paralegals will become specialized in certain areas of law while others use this career as a steppingstone before attending law school. The median salary is \$ 56,230 and the profession is expected to have *much faster than average job growth at 14%* through 2031 (BLS, 2021). Any student in grades 10, 11 or 12 is welcome to take the test. All ASVAB Career Exploration Program tests will be offered through an online format. Students may register for the test by clicking HERE. While the US military branches all use the ASVAB as an admissions exam, students do NOT have to be

interested in military careers to take the test. Taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test does not obligate students to enlist! Please find more information about the ASVAB here.
