#### **College and Career of the Week**

The <u>University of Massachusetts at Amherst</u> is located approximately 95 miles from the BOWA area. UMASS/Amherst is the flagship campus in the <u>UMASS system</u>. <u>Founded in 1863</u>, UMASS/Amherst currently enrolls over 23,000 undergraduate students, only 25% from out of state. More than 95 undergraduate <u>programs</u> are offered within 11 academic schools. UMASS/Amherst currently ranks as #26 in US News & World Report's (2022-2023) "<u>Top 100 Public Universities</u>". Also, UMASS/Amherst is a member of the acclaimed "<u>Five College Consortium</u>" where students can enroll in classes at the other four colleges (Amherst, Hampshire, Mount Holyoke, and Smith). Campus life is active with over <u>400 student groups</u>, organizations and activities available. Varsity athletes can compete in <u>19 NCAA-D1 teams</u> in the <u>Atlantic 10 Conference</u>. "Chemists and materials scientists study substances at the atomic and molecular levels and analyze the ways in which the substances interact with one another" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021). Entry level job seekers must have a bachelors' degree to work in this career field. With additional education or experience, chemists can specialize in specific areas such as water, hazardous waste and analytical chemistry jobs. The median salary is \$ 79,760 and the profession is expected to have average job growth at 6% through 2031 (BLS, 2021). The academy will be held at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut from July 16, 2023, to July 22, 2023. Professional behavior and appropriate dress will be required of all students attending this program. The program is not exclusive to students

interested in criminal justice. Due to the vast diversity in our workforce, any student with an interest in the FBI, what we do and how a relationship with the FBI can help their school is encouraged to apply. All students will be evaluated based on their application (GPA, school activities and community involvement) and essay to determine which students will be offered a seat in the class. None of the above elements will be the sole basis of evaluation of an application and the application process should be taken seriously by all applicants. This application and supporting essay must be received by email **no later than Friday, March 31, 2023**, for panel review. Hand delivered applications will not be accepted because of security policies. Incomplete and late applications will not be accepted.
