College and Career of the Week: This week's college is the Marist College and the career of the week is Film/Video **Editing and Production.** Founded in 1929, Marist College is located in Poughkeepsie, New York, approximately 80 miles from the BOW area. The college enrolls approximately 5,000 undergraduate students and offers 47 Bachelor's degrees. The cost of attendance is approximately \$61,000. Marist also has two satellite campuses in Manhattan, New York and Florence, Italy. Film and video/editors and production specialists "manipulate moving images that entertain or inform an audience" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2018). Expected job growth is much faster than average at approximately 11% through 2028. This is due to the increase in independent film/video projects created by internet-based producers. The average annual salary is \$62,650 for editors and \$54,570 for camera operators.
