Spelman College is a private, liberal arts college for young women located in Atlanta, Georgia. Founded in 1881, Spelman is an HBCU (historically black college or university) that ranks #1 out of all HBCUs (US News & World Report). Also, Spelman is part of the "Atlanta University Center", a consortium with Morehouse College and Clark Atlanta University. Approximately 2,300 undergraduate students have over 30 majors & minors to choose from. Student life is very active with over 85 clubs & organizations and social events. Athletics were abandoned by Spelman over 10 years ago due to costs and to focus on promoting overall wellness to the students. Annual tuition, room and board is \$44,551 (2022-2023). ### **Summer Opportunities**

• FBI New Haven Future Law Enforcement Summer Youth Academy is now open to 16- to 18-year-old high school students. The academy will be held at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut from July 16, 2023, to July 22, 2023. Professional behavior and appropriate dress will be required of all students attending this program. The program is not exclusive to students interested in criminal justice. Due to the vast diversity in our workforce, any student with an interest in the FBI, what we do and how a relationship with the FBI can help their school is encouraged to apply. All students will be evaluated based on their application (GPA, school

- activities and community involvement) and essay to determine which students will be offered a seat in the class. None of the above elements will be the sole basis of evaluation of an application and the application process should be taken seriously by all applicants. This application and supporting essay must be received by email **no later than Friday, March 31, 2023**, for panel review. Hand delivered applications will not be accepted because of security policies. Incomplete and late applications will not be accepted.
