College and Career of the Week

The <u>University of Connecticut at Waterbury</u> is a regional branch campus of UCONN that has served its students for over 70 years. Most undergraduates who begin their college education here will choose to transfer to UCONN/Storrs once they have earned at least 54 credits. However, students also have the option to attend UCONN/Waterbury for complete bachelor's programs in <u>9 majors</u> such as allied health, business administration, English, and human development & family sciences. The campus is in the revitalized downtown area of Waterbury, approximately 18 miles from ARHS. <u>Annual tuition</u> for in-state residents is \$16,332 (2023-2024). "Biological Technicians help biological and medical scientists conduct laboratory tests and experiments" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021). Most biological technicians have earned a bachelor's degree in biology or a related science. Many entry-level bio technician positions are filled by recent college graduates who are looking to learn more before pursuing higher education and/or more specialized positions. The average annual salary is \$48,140 and faster than average job growth is expected (9%) through 2031 (BLS, 2021). - FBI New Haven Future Law Enforcement Summer Youth Academy is now open to 16- to 18-year-old high school students. The academy will be held at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut from July 16, 2023, to July 22, 2023. Professional behavior and appropriate dress will be required of all students attending this program. The program is not exclusive to students interested in criminal justice. Due to the vast diversity in our workforce, any student with an interest in the FBI, what we do and how a relationship with the FBI can help their school is encouraged to apply. All students will be evaluated based on their application (GPA, school activities and community involvement) and essay to determine which students will be offered a seat in the class. None of the above elements will be the sole basis of evaluation of an application and the application process should be taken seriously by all applicants. This application and supporting essay must be received by email no later than Friday, March 31, 2023, for panel review. Hand delivered applications will not be accepted because of security policies.
