**College and Career of the Week:** Northern Vermont University (formerly known as Johnson State College) is a public university located in Johnson, Vermont, approximately 275 miles away from the BOWA area. A second campus is located in Lyndon, Vermont (formerly known as Lyndon State College). NVU at Johnson enrolls about 1,150 students. Interesting majors include mountain resort management (6 nearby resorts), atmospheric science (climate change, meteorology), exercise science (program is rated top 5% in the country), psychology (BS/MS in 5 years), criminology, BFA in Woodworking (partnership with Vermont Woodworking School) and a new nursing program that will begin in fall of 2022. NVU sponsors 13 D3 athletic teams who compete in the North Atlantic Conference. Annual tuition, room and board for out-ofstate undergraduates is \$38,870 (2021-2022). For more information, go to NVU's admissions website, check out their guick facts or take an online tour. NOTE - in the fall of 2022, ALL of Vermont's public colleges will be renamed. NVU will become "Vermont State University at Johnson". Line installers and repairers install or repair electrical power systems and telecommunications cables, including fiber optics" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). Line workers meet with many dangers on the job including highvoltage electricity, being exposed to the elements and working high above ground. A high school diploma or equivalent is required to obtain an entry-level position in this field. The median salary is \$75,030 and zero percent job growth is expected through 2030 (BLS, 2020).
