College & Career of the Week: <u>East Carolina University</u> is located in Greenville, North Carolina, approximately 580 miles from the BOW area. Notable <u>facts</u> include over 23,000 undergraduates are enrolled, approximately 40% of all students major in STEM or health care fields and more than 20% participate in research projects with faculty. Eight of ECU's twelve colleges offer over 80 <u>undergraduate degree programs</u>. ECU also has a maritime/ocean studies facility in the Outer Banks of North Carolina called the <u>ECU Outer Banks Campus</u>. The facility conducts research within the fields of Estuarine Ecology, Coastal Engineering and Ocean Energy, Public Policy and Coastal Sustainability, Maritime Heritage, and Coastal Processes. <u>Annual tuition for out-of-state residents</u> is approximately \$33,652.00. Learn more by visiting the <u>website</u> and taking a virtual tour.

"Maritime Archeologists, also known as underwater archeologists, study past human cultures with an emphasis on how humans interacted with the world's oceans, lakes and river systems" (oceantoday.noaa.gov). Maritime archaeologists must obtain a master's degree in archeology to work in this career path. Most people will begin by studying subjects such as history, oceanography, geology and chemistry. As with any <u>underwater job</u>, one must become an expert diver and extensive global travel is required. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, <u>archeologists</u> earn an average salary of \$63,670 annually and the field is expected to have a 5% increase (faster than average) job growth through 2029.
