College and Career of the Week: Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute is a private university located in Troy, New York (near Albany), approximately 130 miles from the BOWA area. Founded in 1824, RPI currently enrolls over 6,200 undergraduates who are pursuing technology-based careers. More than 110 programs (bachelors, masters, doctorate) are offered in majors such as computer science, architecture, engineering (mechanical, chemical, biomedical, civil and aerospace) and business, as well as many accelerated programs. Students can enjoy many clubs and activities on campus as well as 21 NCAA-Division 3 athletic teams (Liberty League Conference). Annual tuition, room and board is \$77,763 (2021-2022). "Special effects artists and animators create images that appear to move and visual effects for various forms of media and entertainment", (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). To obtain an entry level position in this field, special effects artists and animators usually have a bachelor's degree in either art or computer graphics. While some are self-employed, many work for film and entertainment companies. The median salary is \$77,700 and much faster than average job growth is expected (16%) through 2030(BLS, 2020). For

Midterm exams will start on Thursday, January 20th and run through Tuesday, January 25th (please see the schedule <u>here</u>). Second semester will start on Wednesday, January 26th and will follow the previously posted letter day calendar (the 26th will be a **C day** and Spartan Seminar day). As an FYI, we do not anticipate making further adjustments to the semester (i.e. class days) due to inclement weather disruptions. We would only push further in to 2nd semester if we missed an exam day due to a weather cancellation (as per exam period schedule attached). However, there may be unforeseen circumstances, which would necessitate further adjustment.
