College/Career of the Week: Salve Regina University is a private Catholic university located in Newport, Rhode Island. Founded in 1934 by the Sister of Mercy, Salve Regina currently enrolls about 2,800 students in over 60 undergraduate and graduate programs. Most popular majors include nursing, business, criminal justice and biology. SRU students can choose from over 70 clubs and organizations when they aren't simply enjoying their beautiful, seaside campus. Athletes compete in 20 NCAA Division III athletic teams within the Commonwealth Coast Conference. Annual tuition, room and board is \$60,070 (2021-2022). "Registered nurses (RNs) provide and coordinate patient care and educate patients and the public about various health conditions" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). In order to become employed, Registered nurses must graduate from an accredited nursing program at a college, university or nursing school and pass a national certification exam called the NCLEX. Nurses must also obtain state licensure in each individual state. Many nurses choose to specialize in a specific area of practice such as pediatrics (with children) or oncology (cancer patients). The median salary for nurses is \$75,330 (national average) per year and the profession is expected to have average growth at 9% through 2030 (BLS, 2020). Parent Drop Off/Pick Up: As a reminder, the morning drop off location is on the side of the school following the one-way traffic flow from North Pease out to Newton Road.
