Senior Happenings

Senior Parent Night: Senior Parent Night will be held in person on **September 2nd at 6:30 at ARHS**. Counselors will provide an overview of the college application process for parents. As these meetings will take place in classrooms, we will need to limit attendance to **one parent or guardian per child**. Senior Late Arrival/Early Dismissal: ARHS Seniors may be eligible for late arrival or early dismissal designation based on study halls and good standing. In order to apply for this designation, students must print a physical copy of their schedules, circle the appropriate periods for the later arrival or early dismissal and have a parent/guardian sign the form for approval before submitting to the student's associate principal to be reviewed and processed. Please note: the approval process will take a few days after the signed schedule has been submitted. Approval will be reflected on the student's schedule through PowerSchool and is indicated when the study hall is changed to a "late arrival" or "early dismissal."

Community Service: Amity High School offers a community service graduation incentive for all students. Students who complete and document 100 hours of community service hours over the course of their 4 years at Amity High School will receive a certificate of recognition and an honor cord on the day of their graduation.
