

College and Career of the Week

Hampton University is a private university located in Hampton, Virginia. Founded in 1868, Hampton is an HBCU (historically black college or university) with a fascinating history. There are approximately 3,300 students enrolled with almost 100 majors offered such as nursing, business, criminal justice, aviation management and education. Hampton students are heavily involved in many clubs and organizations, as well as intramurals/recreation sports. Also, varsity athletes can choose from 14 teams that compete in NCAA Division 1 (Colonial Athletic Association). Annual tuition, room and board is \$42,648 (2022-2023). "<u>Machinists and tool & die makers</u> set up and operate equipment to produce precision metal parts, instruments, and tools" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021). <u>Machinists</u> create products while tool & die makers create tools for cutting and forming metal. Both learn their trade on the job and/or through specific training programs. The national average annual salary is \$47,940 with *below average job growth expected (1%)* through 2031 (BLS, 2021). However, the average annual salary in CT is <u>higher at</u> <u>\$55,750</u> (tool & die makers average is \$68,380) and more job openings are expected to become available due to retirements and general attrition.
