College and Career of the Week

Securing the top spot again in ARHS's "50 Top Colleges" ranking is the University of Connecticut (aka "UCONN"). Originally founded as an agricultural school over 140 years ago, UCONN has grown to include 5 campuses and is nationally recognized as a top 25 public university. The main campus is in Storrs, followed by the 4 regional campuses in Stamford, Waterbury, Avery Point (Groton), and Hartford. Additionally, the university has three graduate centers - UCONN School of Law & Graduate Business Learning Center and the School of Social Work, both located in Hartford, and the UCONN Health Center in Farmington. Almost 19,000 undergraduate students are enrolled at the Storrs campus. There are over 100 undergraduate majors offered within the 14 schools of the university. Those students who begin college as undecided majors are encouraged to explore their options via the ACES program. The UCONN Huskies sponsor 19 NCAA Division-1 athletic teams who compete in the Big East Athletic Conference (football in the FBS Independent Conference). Annual tuition for CT residents is \$19,434 (2022-2023) at the Storrs campus, and \$16,564 at the regional campuses. Average housing and meal plan costs (at Storrs) total \$13,622. "Social workers help people solve and cope with problems in their everyday lives" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021). Social workers are employed in many different types of healthcare settings such as schools, hospitals, mental health facilities, social service agencies and private practices (BLS, 2021). All social workers are required to obtain state licensure, and most will need to earn a masters' degree to practice. Social workers may also want to specialize in a specific area of practice such as families & schools, healthcare and substance abuse. The average annual salary is \$50,390 (higher in CT) with expected job growth to be 12% (faster than average) through 2030 (BLS, 2021). To learn more about

Amity Happenings and Information

- Order and Prepay for Underclass Pictures: Ahead of our upcoming underclass picture days on September 20 and 21, parents can order and prepay for prints of their children's school pictures online beginning on Tuesday, September 6. Instructions are available here. The payment portal will be active until Wednesday, September 28. After this date, Amity's bulk order will be processed, and digital proof cards will be e-mailed to parents who did not place orders. These proof cards will feature a watermarked proof image along with the codes to order prints online. At that point, prices will be slightly higher, and orders will be shipped directly to families' homes rather than to the school.

Attendance Procedures for 2022-2023 - clarification

At this week's Class Meetings, we provided information about changes to our attendance procedures, and we have received a few requests for clarification since then. To help make sure that everyone understands the updated attendance expectations, it helps to understand how changes in the state's attendance rules have affected our policies for this year, so here is a quick summary of them: Last year the state Department of Education changed its rules regarding attendance and chronic absenteeism, which forced us to update our local attendance policy. The updated attendance policy reduced the number of categories for types of absences. We are including a link to the whole Amity BOE attendance policy here for details. The first two pages address the new categories for attendance and the types of documentation that we can accept for them (much of this is copied verbatim from the state

regulations):

The most important things to know about the updated policy are:

- The state rules, and now our local policies, separate all absences into two basic categories: absences parents were aware of and informed the school about and absences where students miss school without parent permission.
- The first nine absences from school in a year can be "excused" by a parent if they send in a note. They can include the reason for the absence, but it is not required.
- Absence 10 and beyond need to meet certain state criteria for a student to not be considered "chronically absent" by the state, and we may need more documentation than just a parent note for some types of absences. Being quarantined for Covid would certainly count as one of the criteria that would justify additional absences, and we will still be tracking Covid cases among our students, so we will know whether that is the driving reason for a student's high number of absences. Other circumstances such as a chronic health condition or an exceptional learning opportunity that the school is aware of and that caused time away from school would also count for this.
- Loss of credit for a course due to excessive absences occurs at 16 absences for full-year courses
 and 8 absences for half-year courses, so if a student is attending school regularly this is not likely
 to become an issue.

Senior Happenings

- **Senior Parent Night** will be held on Tuesday, September 20th at 6:30 PM. School counselors will be reviewing the steps for the college application process.
- Senior Portrait Sessions: Robert Taylor Photography has extended the window for senior
 portrait sessions and added additional dates to their calendar. They are open nights and
 weekends to accommodate students' schedules. Those seniors who have not already been
 photographed should book an appointment via <u>SignUpGenius</u> before the end of September. For
 more details on the process, students should consult the <u>explanatory letter</u> they received in
 June.

Important Start-of-the-Year Reminders

- Covid Reporting Procedures: If your child tests positive for Covid, please contact the school's Health Office and report this to the school nurses. They will help you determine the length of your child's quarantine and their return-to-school date.
- School Lunch Updates for 2022-2023: During the transition back to normal school operations in school year 2022-23, Amity Regional School District No. 5 has opted into the School Meals Assistance Revenue for Transition (SMART) funds providing meals (lunch at the middle schools and both breakfast and lunch at the high school) at no cost for all students from the beginning of the school year until the end of December 2022. The district will notify parents and guardians of the date when students who are not directly certified or have no approved application on file will be expected to pay for their meals. Online applications for free and reduced-price meal benefits and instructions can be found at www.amityregion5.org, under your child's school website, Parent Tab, Link/Resources Tab, Free/Reduced Meal Information. Children may receive

free or reduced-price meals if your household's income falls at or below the limits of the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines, which can be found following the above link and clicking FAQ. A paper copy of the application can also be found following the above link or in the school's main office. Use one Free and Reduced-price School Meals Application for all students in your household.

All ASVAB Career Exploration Program tests will be offered through an online format. Students may register to take the test by signing up here. While the US military branches all use the ASVAB as an admissions exam, students do NOT have to be interested in military careers to take the test.
