College and Career of the Week: This week's college is Middlesex Community College and the career of the week is Veterinary Technician. Middlesex Community College (MxCC) is located in Middletown, Connecticut, approximately 32 miles from the BOW area. A second, satellite campus is located at Platt High School in Meriden, CT. According to their website, the current enrollment is approximately 4,200 students (2018-2019). Over 70 degree and certificate programs are offered at MxCC including allied health (CNA, EMT, nutrition, pharmacy tech, veterinary tech), business, manufacturing technology, STEM and humanities. Annual tuition for full time, in-state residents is \$ 4,476.00 (2020-2021). MxCC is one of the 12 community colleges in Connecticut where students can attend for little or no cost. Visit the PACT website here to learn more. "Veterinary technologists and technicians do medical tests that help diagnose animals' injuries and illnesses" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). They also work alongside veterinarians to care for animals. To work in this career, vet technologists need a bachelors' degree, vet technicians need an associates' degree and both must pass certification exams, depending upon local state laws. The median salary is \$35,320 (national average) per year and the profession is expected to have *faster than average* growth at 19% through 2028(BLS, 2019). Note that the average salary in Connecticut for vet techs is much higher at \$49,900 per year (BLS,2019). AP Exam Update

Exam Access: Two days prior to each exam, students should receive an e-mail containing an exam ticket that is unique to each exam they are registered for. If an e-mail does not come through, the exam ticket can be accessed through their AP Classroom account. If neither option works, please reach out to your teacher, Ms. Boyns (Marian.Boyns@amityregion5.org), or Mrs. Ferguson (Gerilyn.Ferguson@amityregion5.org).

Troubleshooting during exams: We have set up a Google Voice account that can be accessed at the following number: 203-516-0430

Students should call this number if they are having difficulty accessing exams, submitting responses, or if they are experiencing other problems. It would be a good idea for students to write this number at the top of their AP Checklist, if they should

need it during the exam. The number will be answered during the hours of the AP exams.

Cancellation/Refunds: If a student has already requested an exam cancellation in Total Registration, please know that we are aware of that request. We are not approving those requests at this time because College Board still plans to send exam tickets out, regardless of cancellation requests. As a result, students can essentially wait until the time of their exam to decide whether or not to take it. It is not necessary to request a cancellation. Any student who does not take an AP exam that they registered for will be eligible for a full refund. During the first week of June, we will receive a full list of which students completed an exam. Once we receive that information, we will begin processing refunds through Total Registration. This will not happen until June 5th, at the earliest. Thank you for your patience!

Summer Virtual STEM Opportunity: To help continue educational opportunities during this time, a team of Stanford and Harvard students and graduates are offering a Summer STEM Institute (SSI), a virtual summer research program. For more details, please visit the <u>website</u>. The Summer STEM Institute is a six-week virtual summer program consisting of three main parts:

A research and data science bootcamp: SSI will equip students with the valuable skills to conduct computational research. Students will learn how to apply data science to interdisciplinary projects with real-world impact.

A Masterclass lecture series: Students will be connected with 30+ highly accomplished speakers from Harvard, Stanford, MIT, and other top institutions—from Forbes 30 under 30 awardees, Intel Science Talent Search (STS) winners, to International Math Olympiad Medalists.

A research project: Students will also have the opportunity to conduct a research project in a scientific field of interest. Students will be matched to a virtual lab and work closely with mentors, including International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) winners and Research Science Institute (RSI) scholars.
