College/Career of the Week: The <u>University of California at Irvine</u> is a public university that was <u>founded in 1965</u>. UCI currently serves approximately 37,000 students; over 29,000 are undergraduate students and about 14,000 of them <u>live on campus</u>. Over 85 <u>majors</u> and 70 minors are available to students and undergraduate research opportunities are available through the <u>UROP-Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program</u>. <u>Student life</u> is very active with many clubs and organizations on campus as well as many recreational sports/activities. The "anteaters" also cheer on their <u>18 NCAA Division 1 teams</u> (<u>Big West Conference</u>). <u>Annual tuition, room and board</u> for out-of-state students is \$ 66,220 (2021-2022). # Notes from Counseling Department

**Attention Juniors!** Are you interested in learning more about <u>West Point Military Academy</u>? If so, consider applying to their <u>Summer Leaders Experience</u> (deadline is March 15<sup>th</sup>). SLC is a weeklong, immersive on-campus experience. (Two sessions are available, May 28 – June 3 OR June 4 – June 10, 2022.) There is no fee to apply, and generous need-based scholarships are available. Standardized test scores are not required, but ideal applicants have a strong academic background, have participated in team sports and other extracurricular activities. Note: When you apply for SLE, you are also submitting an admissions screening application.

The **ASVAB - Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery** will be given here at Amity on **Thursday, April 21, 2022**. While the ASVAB is used by the military for recruiting purposes, individuals for career exploration and identifying skills for future careers also use it. Students may take the test for personal use and there is NO military obligation from participating. For more information, please visit the <u>ASVAB website</u> <u>here</u>. Are you a student thinking of pursuing a career in law enforcement? The New Haven FBI Field Office in partnership with the Yale University Police Department will be offering a summer youth program called Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) from July 17-July 23, 2022. Students who are graduating in the spring of 2022 are not eligible. Students 16-18 yrs. of age are eligible. This is an overnight camp at Yale University. FLEYA will give 30 Connecticut high school students between the ages of 16 and 18, an inside look at today's FBI, while simultaneously exposing them to various local, state and federal law enforcement agencies and practices. Classroom training will be provided on various subjects including: cyber technology, investigative forensics, domestic and international terrorism, civil rights (hate crimes) and more. Parent Drop Off/Pick Up: As a reminder, the morning drop off location is on the side of the school following the one-way traffic flow from North Pease out to Newton Road.
