College and Career of the Week: The University of Central Florida is a public university located in Orlando, Florida. UCF also has 3 satellite campuses as well as an online learning division. The university is comprised of 13 colleges, and offers over 230 degree programs to approximately 70,000 students. Clubs, organizations, and activities abound for undergraduate and graduate students alike. The UCF Knights sponsor 15-NCAA Division 1 athletic teams who compete in the Big 12 Conference. Annual tuition, room and board for out-of-state students is estimated at \$35,177 (2021-2022). "Respiratory therapists care for patients who have trouble breathing—for example, from a chronic respiratory disease, such as asthma or emphysema" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2020). Respiratory therapists support all aspects of patients' breathing and lung functions. Most work in hospitals or long-term healthcare facilities. To obtain an entry level position, RTs must have at least an associate's degree and be licensed. The national median salary is \$61,830 and the profession is expected to have **much faster** than average job growth at 23% through 2030 (BLS, 2020).
