Rather than spending the entire day reviewing class and school rules, homework expectations and logistics, we spend the first day of school on Wednesday celebrating the opening of the 2019-2020 school with an enthusiastic welcome for our entire school community.

On Wednesday, students will report directly to their designated homeroom/Spartan Seminar room locations to begin the day's activities. School offices closed on Tuesday, August 27th, in the AM: Please note that the entire building will be closed on Tuesday, August 27, from 7:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. as all staff will be at the opening of school convocation and participating in professional development.

Letter Day Calendar: This upcoming school year's letter day calendar with important program information can be found here. This important resource for students and parents is subject to change due to weather, etc. Updates will be communicated if a change is necessitated.

High School Counseling Department and Main Office Hours: Monday, August 26th, will be a faculty/staff only day for Amity Regional High School. Counselors will be available sporadically throughout the day, but will also be in meetings for large portions of the day. Due to the District #5 convocation on Tuesday, August 27th, main and counseling offices will be opening at 9:30am and closing at 2:30pm. School year hours (7:00am-3:30pm) will begin on Wednesday, August 28th.

Wednesday Schedule/Student Summer Work: As mentioned, we will be holding a special schedule on the first day of school where we will celebrate welcoming students back to school and focus on building a community! While students will meet their teachers during brief (19 minute) classes on Wednesday, they are not required to bring any summer work or school materials with them. Due to the focus of the day, and the limited time in the class

schedule, **all summer work will be due starting on the first day of class on Thursday, August 29**th.

Late Bus Schedule: Late buses, which begin on September 10th, are provided on most Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from ARHS. Students are able to stay after school for a designated program or in a supervised area (such as with a teacher or in the library). Late buses pick up at the high school between 3:40-3:55, with one bus designated for each town.

Scheduled power outage this weekend: On Saturday, August 24, 2019, there will be a complete power outage for approximately 8-10 hours at the Amity Regional High School campus. This will impact both building access, as the building will be closed, and technology access to PowerSchool/Unified Classroom. The testing will take place during the day on Saturday and technology should be back up and running by 7am on Monday, August 26th.

Drop Off/Pick Up Instructions: Please find a copy of morning drop off and afternoon pick up instructions here. Please note: the traffic flow from North Pease Road through the high school parking lot becomes very dense during arrival after 7:20 am. Students who do not drive/park at school are strongly encouraged to take the bus. Also please note: **for safety reasons, Newton Road is not a designated student drop-off area.**

Student Parking: Student parking at Amity Regional High School is restricted to juniors and seniors. Eligible students who wish to drive to school must register their vehicles and pay a \$100.00 registration fee. Please see this memo regarding the process for registering for a parking tag as well as the parking rules and regulations. Eligible seniors and juniors may park on campus without a parking tag (while applications are being processed) through September 6th. Parking tags must be displayed beginning September 9th.
