College and Career of the Week: <u>Boston University</u> is located in Boston, Massachusetts, approximately 135 miles from the BOW area. Founded in 1873, BU is one of Amity High School's "<u>Top 50 Colleges</u>" (most applications sent). With almost 17,000 undergraduate students who can choose from over <u>300 programs of study</u>, BU is the ultimate large, urban university. BU's <u>annual tuition</u>, fees and housing/board costs are \$74,712. Through the BU <u>Scholarship Assurance program</u>, 100% of financial need may be met (for those who qualify). Most biological

technicians have earned a bachelor's degree in biology or a related science. Many entry-level bio technician positions are filled by recent college graduates who are looking to learn more before pursuing higher education and/or more specialized positions. The average annual salary is \$45,860 and faster than average job growth is expected (5%) through 2029 (BLS, 2019). College Admissions Presentation: The Counseling Departments at Amity Regional High School and Fairfield Ludlowe and Warde High Schools collaborated to offer a virtual presentation this past **Monday, November 9th.** Presenter Jeff Selingo is a researchers and author who has written about higher education for more than two decades and is a New York Times bestselling author of three books, including his latest book, *Who Gets In & Why: A Year Inside College Admissions*. In this <u>presentation</u>, Jeff provided valuable insight about the inner workings of universities and a practical roadmap for students and parents especially in this changing world of college admissions.

ARHS Bus Evacuation Drill: Please note that on Monday, November 16th and Tuesday, November 17th, we will be holding our annual bus evacuation drills during drop-off. Students who take the bus will be allowed in to the school building starting at 7:10am for these two days only in order to expedite the traffic flow.
