

High School Happenings and Information

Junior Prom: Tonight is junior prom at Grassy Hill Country Club. Please be advised that students must be at the prom within half an hour of the start (7:00) and can not leave until half an hour before the end time (11:00).

Late Arrival for Students: Please be reminded that Monday morning is a professional development 2 hour session for the first 2 hours of the morning. After the professional development session, we will operate on a 2 hour delay schedule for the school day.

Final Exam Schedule: Final exams for the 2016-2017 school year will begin on June 8^{th} and run through the last day of school, June 14^{th} . We will have 2 exams per day, with each exam running 2 hours a piece. Make-up sessions are built in to each day after the regularly scheduled exam period and on the last day of school (June 14^{th}).
