

Safety Reminder- Morning Drop Off: If a student is being dropped off in the morning by car at the high school, the approved traffic flow is one way from the back entrance off of North Pease Road, exiting through the front driveway on to Newton Road. This traffic flow from becomes very dense during arrival after 7:20 am. Students who do not drive/park at school are strongly encouraged to take the bus. <u>Please note: for safety reasons, Newton Road is not a designated student drop-off area.</u> The ARHS Security Personnel are occasionally stationed at the faculty/bus entrance to the school and at the end of the fire access road to assist
