Happenings and Information

Attention seniors-first quarter grades: If you would like first quarter grades to be sent to colleges, you must fill out a form in the Counseling Office. We will plan to send out first quarter beginning the week of November 13th, according to the college deadlines.

SCSU Field Admission Day: Southern Connecticut State
University will hold a Field Admission Day at Amity Regional High
School on Tuesday, November 14th. Interested seniors may meet
with an SCSU admission representative. SCSU admission
representatives will review completed applications and provide onthe-spot admission notifications. Students must apply to Southern
Connecticut via the Common Application by November
7th. Interested seniors should speak with school counselors or see
Ms. Salemme in the Counseling Center to schedule a meeting.

Here are the criteria which SCSU shared. If you do not fit into this criteria please speak with your school counselor:

- College Prep courses or higher
- 2.7 GPA or higher
- At least a 980 SAT or a 19-21 ACT score
- Have SCSU as a top 3 choice

UNH Field Admission Day: <u>University of New Haven</u> will hold a Field Admission Day at Amity Regional High School on <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 11th</u>. Interested seniors may meet with a UNH admission's representative on-site. UNH admissions representatives will review completed applications and provide on-the-spot admission notifications. Students must apply through <u>The Common Application</u> by December 4th. Interested seniors are asked to speak school counselors or see Mrs. Vallie in the Career Center to schedule a meeting.

Here are the minimum criteria that UNH shared. If you do not meet these criteria, please speak with your school counselor:

- 2.7 GPA

- 980 new SAT

College Visits: Each week, throughout the fall season, Amity High School hosts representatives from many colleges throughout the country. These representatives are available to share information about their institutions and discuss the admissions process with our juniors and seniors. A list of schools visiting Amity can be found on Naviance or here. If a student is interested in attending any of these info sessions, please register on Naviance and obtain a pass from the Career Center. Students are provided excused absences from class to meet with representatives. Please see a list of colleges here.

Paying for College: The college financial aid process can be overwhelming. The Office of Higher Education State of Connecticut has offered a guide explaining the financial aid process, the types of financial aid available to Connecticut students and links to other sources of information. Local Scholarship Opportunity: **Big Y Foods**: In tribute to both its employees and its customers, Big Y offers an annual scholarship program.
