Happenings and Information

ARHS main office hours during the holiday break: Amity Regional School District No. 5 offices will be closed on Monday, December 25th, Tuesday December 26th and Monday, January 1st. The main office at the high school will be open from 7:00am-2:00pm Wednesday-Friday, December 27th through the 29th.

Community Notice: On the morning of December 27, 2017 we will be making a change to the fiber network connection between the district and the CT Education Network. During this time all network connectivity for the district will be down. The entire

process should take no more than 30 minutes, however due to the complexity of the operation there is the chance of a prolonged outage while we work to resolve the issue.

Reminder-morning student drop off: As a reminder, any student who is being dropped off at school instead of taking the bus must be dropped off on the side entrance to the school after accessing the campus via North Pease Road (the school driveway becomes one way from N. Pease down to the tennis courts between 7:10-7:40). Students are able to be dropped off at the sidewalk as all side doors of the building are unlocked between 7:10-7:34. Please be reminded that the driveway becomes a two-way access from the tennis courts out to the Newton Road exit; drivers must remain in their lane after dropping students off.

Senior Service Learning Program Parent Informational Evening: On Thursday, January 4, 2018 at 6:30pm in the Amity Senior High School Cafeteria, Karen Waterman, the College and Career Counselor will be presenting the expectations and guidelines of 2018 Senior Service Learning Program (generally referred to as the Senior Internship or SSLP) and the new pilot-Senior Interest Project. Parents are asked to attend if your senior is likely to participate in the May-June 2017 unpaid experiential learning program.

Internet Safety presentation: We have invited former law enforcement officer Scott Driscoll to speak with all students in sixth, seventh, and eighth grades about online safety and social media. The student presentations for seventh and eighth grade students will take place during school hours on January 9, 2018.
