Connecticut State University and the featured career is paralegals/legal assistants. WCSU is located in Danbury, CT. The University is made up of four schools including Business, Arts & Sciences, Professional Studies, and Visual and Performing Arts. WCSU has a student body of approximately 5,000 undergraduate students. Over 40 undergraduate majors are offered; click here for a complete listing. In-state resident students pay approximately \$24K per year to attend WCSU. OPEN HOUSE is Sunday, November 4th, 2018. Paralegals and legal assistants perform a variety of tasks to support lawyers and others in legal/government agencies, including maintaining and organizing files, conducting legal research, and drafting documents. Paralegals usually work under licensed attorneys but can also be found working in corporations and government offices. This is a popular position for people considering entering law school as it gives them a chance to try the career before incurring the high costs and time commitment associated with law school.

 Tenth grade students will be taking the PreACT and all 11th grade students will be taking the PSAT during the school day on Wednesday, October 10th. The PSAT is the National Merit Qualifying Test for juniors and is used to help students

- prepare for the SAT test. Students are asked to arrive promptly to school as no late admittance is accepted once the test begins. This testing date is set by the College Board and no make-up testing is permitted for either test.
- All freshmen will be participating in a Link Crew Activity starting in the Brady Center.
- Seniors will participate in a series of activities: senior class panoramic and aerial
 photo, senior class meeting, presentation on financial literacy for post-secondary
 planning, and a presentation on sexual harassment from the Milford Rape Crisis
 Center.

This is a regular full day of school for all student. Attendance will be taken as normal and a modified class schedule will be followed after the morning program.
