College and Career of the Week: This week's featured college is Eastern Connecticut State University and the featured career is Geoscientists. Eastern Connecticut State University is located in Willimantic, Connecticut. The University is made up of four schools including the School of Arts & Sciences, the School of Education and Professional Studies, the Graduate Division and the Office of Continuing Studies. ECSU has approximately 4,300 undergraduate students. Over 50 undergraduate majors are offered; click here for a complete listing. ECSU has 17 NCAA division 3 sports teams, as well as intramural and club sports available. Instate resident students pay approximately \$25K per year to attend.

There will be an <u>open House Saturday</u>, October 13th from 10am until 2pm. In an era where issues like global warming, environmental protection and green-technology are mentioned daily, <u>Geoscientists</u> are in high demand. Geoscientists spend their time in offices and laboratories as well as doing research/fieldwork in many different work sites.
