**College and Career of the Week:** This week's college is **University of Pittsburgh**, and the career of the week is **Dental Hygienist.** Believing that real world experience is most important in education, the <u>University of Pittsburgh</u> guarantees an internship for every undergraduate. The school also encourages volunteer opportunities, study abroad programs and offers over 100 majors, minors and certificate programs in various fields. Dental Hygienists clean teeth, examine patients for signs of oral diseases such as gingivitis, and provide other preventive dental care. They also educate patients on ways to improve and maintain good oral health. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, dental hygienists earn an average salary of \$74,070 per year, have flexible work schedules and can expect rapid job growth through 2026.
