is **Logistician/Supply Chain Manager.** Hofstra University is located in Hempstead, Long Island, New York, which is approximately 25 miles outside of NYC. Hofstra students take advantage of their school's close proximity to Manhattan and engage in interesting internship experiences there. HU also offers special accelerated programs to MD, JD and PA degrees.
