11<sup>th</sup> grade prep for SATs on April 9<sup>th</sup>: As part of our homeroom announcements on Thursday, Juniors were given the SAT Student Guide in preparation for the statewide SAT Testing day on April 9<sup>th</sup>. Any junior that did not receive a SAT Student Guide in homeroom today can get a copy from the Career Center. Also, as we approach the CT School Day SAT and AP testing, please note that Study Island has a fully updated series of lessons and practice tests for SAT, ACT, and AP that all students can access. SAT Day Information: All juniors will be taking the SAT as part of State-mandated Standardized testing on April 9<sup>th</sup>. There is no need to register as ARHS students are automatically registered. Students will be completed the pre-administration session in social studies classes on April 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup>. Students will need to report to school on time at 7:34 with a calculator and number 2 pencils. Students cannot be admitted late to testing. Students will be permitted to leave after testing at approximately 11:45 if they have a parent note. No electronic devices (phones, smartwatches, etc) are permitted in the testing room. As part of the CT SAT Test Day, students can elect up to 4

schools to receive free score reports. More information will be forthcoming in a separate email to 11<sup>th</sup> grade students and parents.

**10**<sup>th</sup> **grade career fair information:** Students can sign up for speakers for our annual Career Day to be held on April 26<sup>th</sup> during session 2. Registration instructions were sent to all students via Google email. The deadline for sign ups is April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### **Senior Happenings**

Senior Service Learning Program (SSLP): The next deadline for participating SSLP students is April 10th, 2019. **Babysitting Basics**: This course is designed to equip youth with skills needed to be ready and to handle an emergency before and when it happens.
