2019-2020 Budget Referendum: A budget referendum vote will be held in each of the District's member towns of Bethany, Orange and Woodbridge on Wednesday, May 8, 2019 between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. at their usual polling locations for

the following question: "SHALL THE AMITY REGIONAL SCHOOLS' BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 IN THE GROSS AMOUNT OF \$49,548,307 AND THE NET AMOUNT OF \$48,627,967 BE APPROVED AS PRESENTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 5?" The Regional Board Secretary's explanatory text with respect to the referendum question, as authorized pursuant to State statute, will be mailed to all residents of the District during the week of May 1st. **Please remember to vote Wednesday, May 8th!**

Holocaust Speaker Visit: On Tuesday May 14 all ninth grade students will hear a presentation given by Endre (Andy) Sarkany. He will share his personal experiences in the Budapest ghetto during the Holocaust, living in Hungary under Soviet influence after World War II, and coming to the United States. This presentation directly supports student learning in World History and English I classes.

Community Service Information for Seniors: Seniors who have completed at least 100 hours of volunteer service during their high school career at Amity will be recognized at graduation for their service to the community. Each Senior will receive a certificate
